

# 2024 INTERCOUNTY DAIRY YOUTH JUDGING COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS

## **AUGUST 17th - CAMPBELLFORD FAIRGROUNDS**

Campbellford Fair, 315 County Road 38, Campbellford, ON

# **Novice Division**

- For contestants 9-10 years of age (as of Jan. 1, 2024)
- Individual participants will be mentored by a group of experienced Judges, 4-H leaders and/or past winners. After their educational sessions, they will be asked to judge three (3) classes on their own and give reasons on one (1). Contestants will be scored on this portion of the program. The remainder of the classes will be judged with assistance from the mentors.
- There will be two (2) awards for this division High Individual and Runner-Up
- Novice age individuals can (if they wish), compete in the Junior Division. However, once they do, they will be unable to go back to Novice the following year
- Novice division fee is \$30/person

## **Junior Division**

- For contestants 11-13 years of age (as of Jan. 1, 2024) \*Novice age can compete as a Junior if they so wish
- Individual participants will be mentored by a group of experienced Judges, 4-H leaders and/or past winners
- After their educational sessions, contestants will judge six (6) classes and will give oral reasons on three (3) classes
- Contestants will complete a written quiz
- Prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place Individual, Placings, Reasons and Quiz
- Junior Division fee is \$50/person

## **Intermediate Division**

- For contestants 14-17 years of age (as of Jan. 1, 2024)
- Contestants will judge nine (9) classes and give oral reasons on four (4) of these classes.
- Contestants must complete the written quiz
- Prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place Individual, Placings, Reasons, and Quiz
- Intermediate division fee is \$50/person

#### **Senior Division**

- For contestants 18-21 years of age (as of Jan. 1, 2024)
- The overall individual senior division champion will be ineligible to compete in subsequent competitions.
- Previous trip winners can compete in the competition but will not be eligible to participate in team trips to a National or International dairy cattle judging competition.
- Contestants will judge nine (9) classes and give oral reasons on six (6) of these classes.
- Contestants must complete the written quiz
- Prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place Individual, Placings, Reasons, Holsteins, Jerseys, Other Breeds and Quiz
- The top four (4) eligible individual contestants from the senior division will represent Ontario at the National 4-H Dairy Cattle Judging Competition held in Madison, WI at the time of the 2024 World Dairy Expo.
- Senior division fee is \$50/person

#### **General Information**

- 1. The written guiz will be based on general information in the "On with the Show" manual.
- 2. Registration entry fee is \$30 per person for the Novice division, and \$50 per person for the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Divisions. Entries must be received by Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- 3. Any parents or guests that are attending the Awards Banquet and dinner must reserve their tickets by emailing <a href="mailto:info@ontario.holstein.ca">info@ontario.holstein.ca</a> before August 9th, 2024. Tickets are \$25 per person. Payment can be made by e-transfer to <a href="mailto:branch@ontario.holstein.ca">branch@ontario.holstein.ca</a> or by cash or cheque on the day of the competition.
- 4. Each contestant must do their own work or they will be disqualified from the competition. Use of cell phones and cameras will not be permitted during the competitive part of the day.
- 5. In the case of a tie, the highest score on reasons will determine the winner. If there is still a tie, the highest score on placings will determine the winner. If a tie still exists, the highest score on the quiz will determine the winner.
- 6. Contestants will be allowed 15 minutes on Reason classes and 10 minutes on Non-Reason classes.
- 7. The contestants will not be allowed to wear any clothes that would indicate person, farm or county origin. The only identification allowed will be that which is given to the contestants on the day of the competition. Appropriate dress code for a youth event is in effect. No muscle shirts, halter tops, etc.
- 8. Judging Dress Code: casual Reasons Dress Code: Business casual (dress pants, skirt, dress shirt, blazer, tie) No shorts or jeans. Banquet Dress Code: Business casual (dress pants, skirt, dress shirt, blazer, tie) No shorts or jeans..
- Contestants are expected to remain for the banquet to complete the competition and be eligible for any prizes or opportunities to judge at World Dairy Expo (some exceptions may apply at the discretion of the committee)
- 10. One "Premiere County" award will be presented at the conclusion of the banquet based on individuals compiled results from the day. There must be a minimum of 5 participants per county to be eligible for this award.
- 11. In the case of any disputes on the day of the competition, the Inter-County Dairy Youth Judging Competition Committee's decision will be final.
